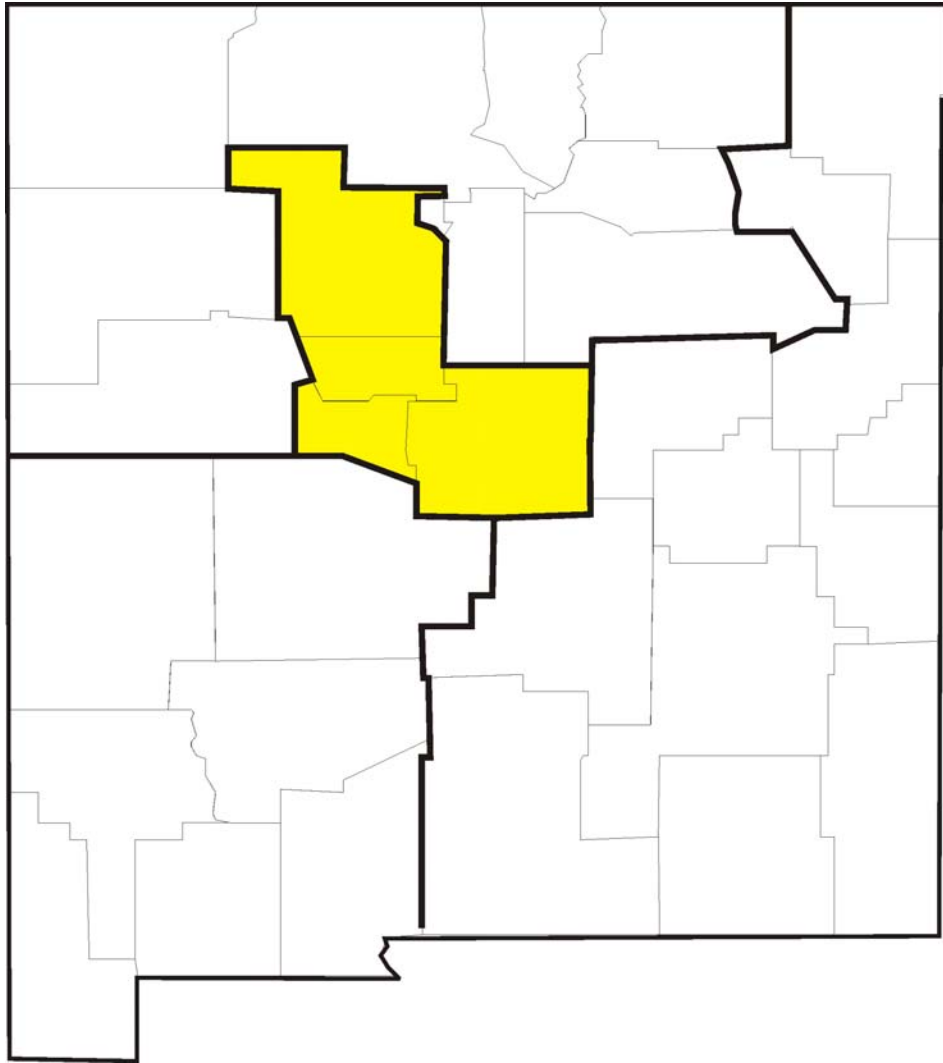

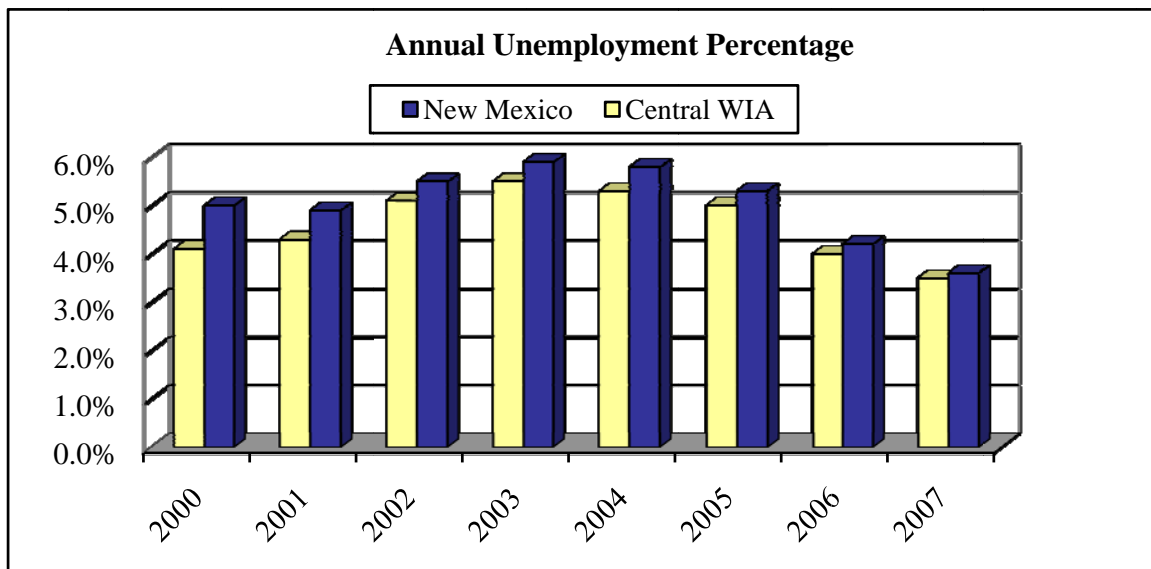
Labor Market Information – Unemployment Rates

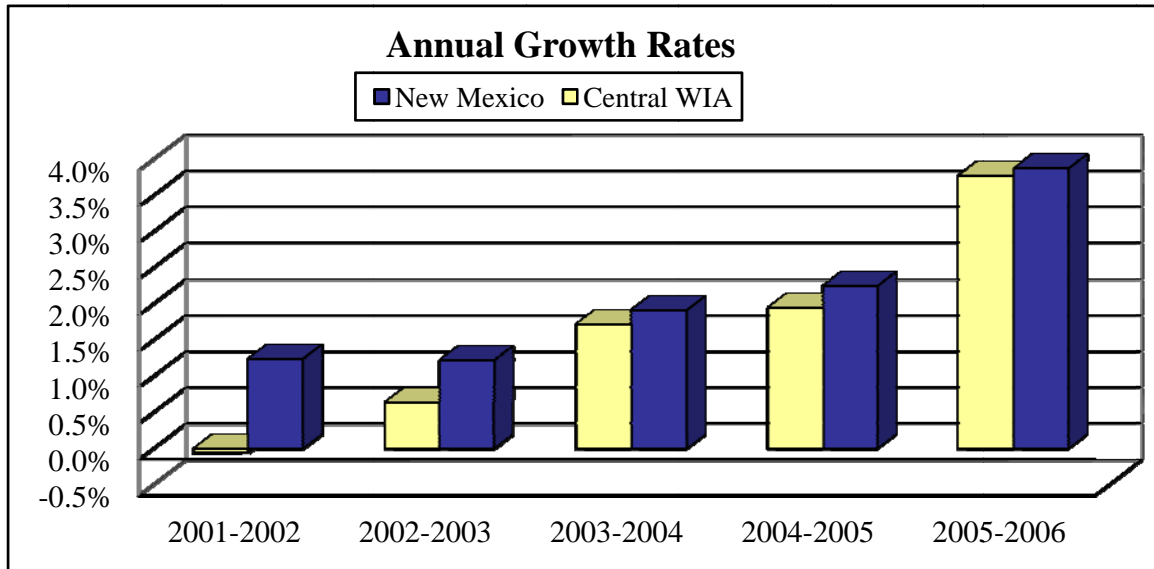
Labor Market Information - Industries

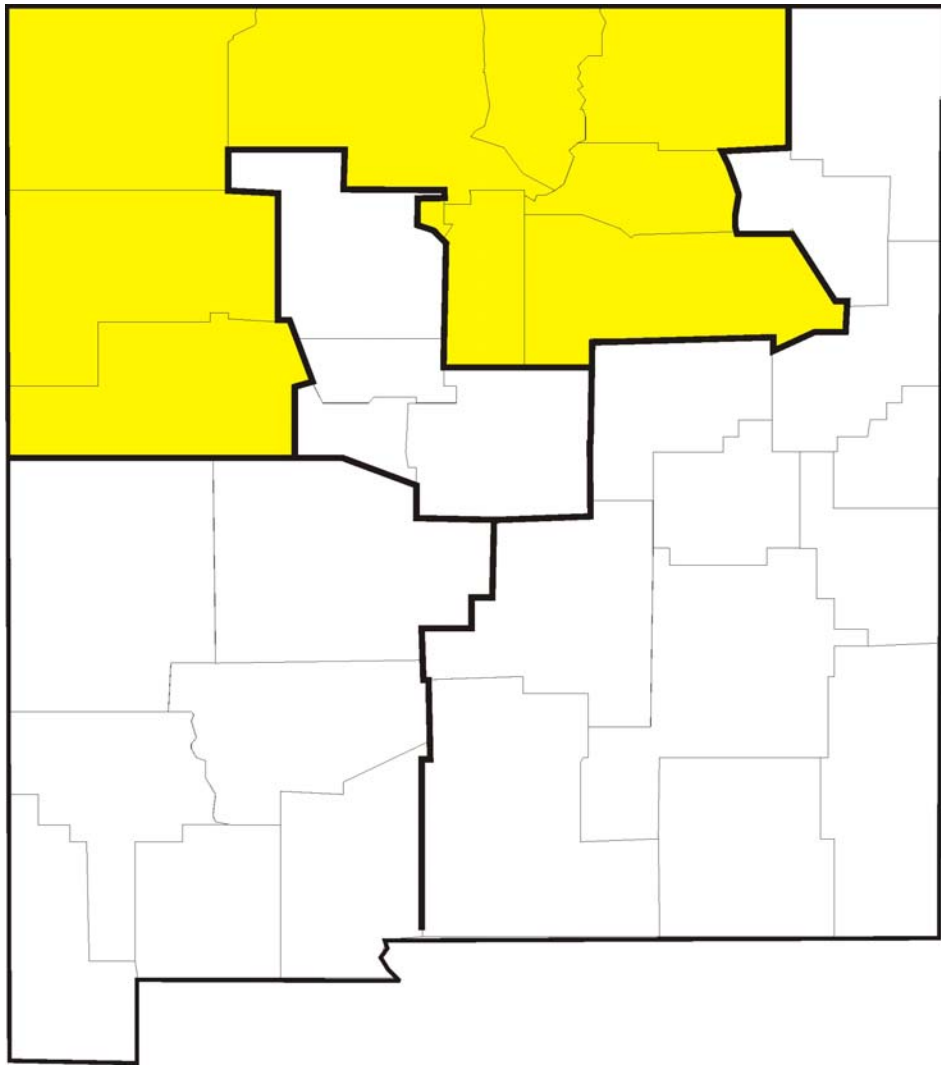

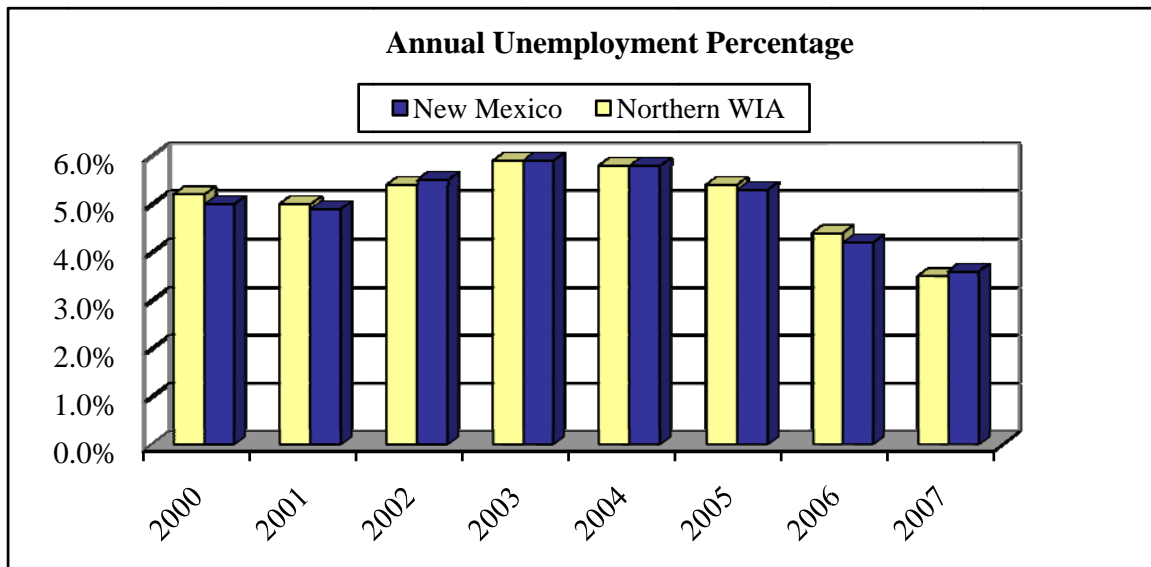

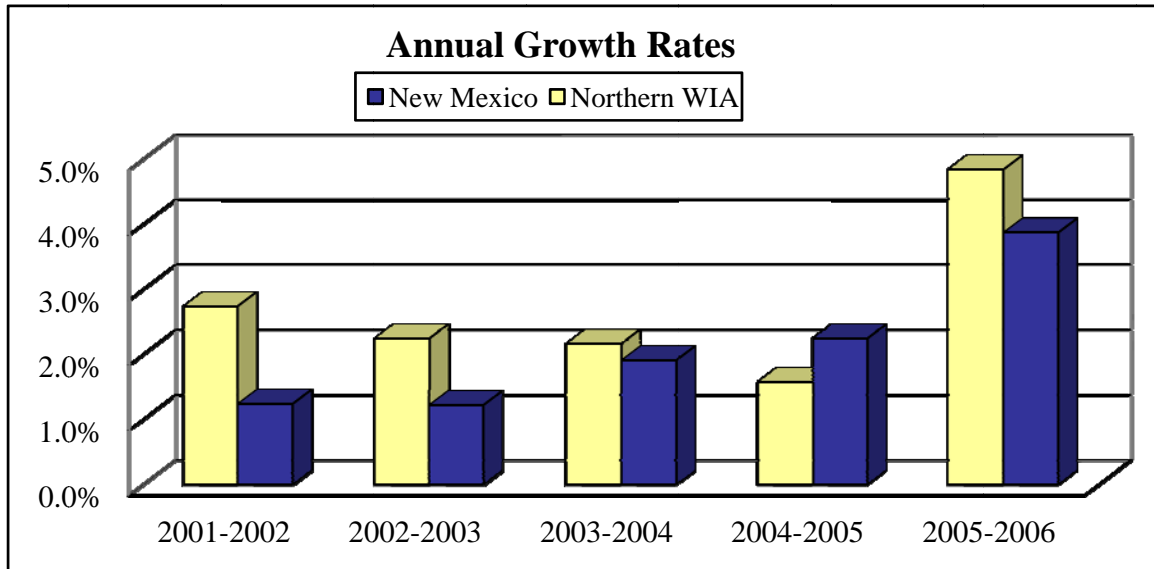

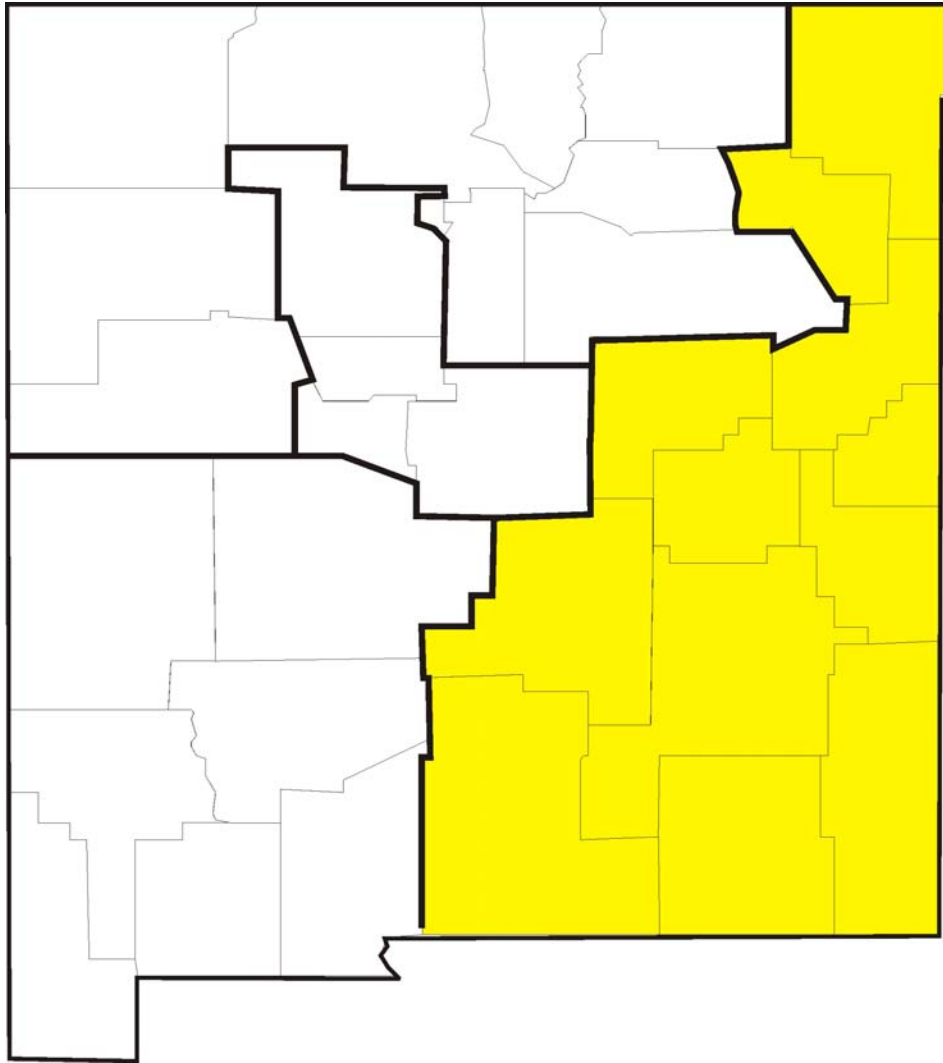

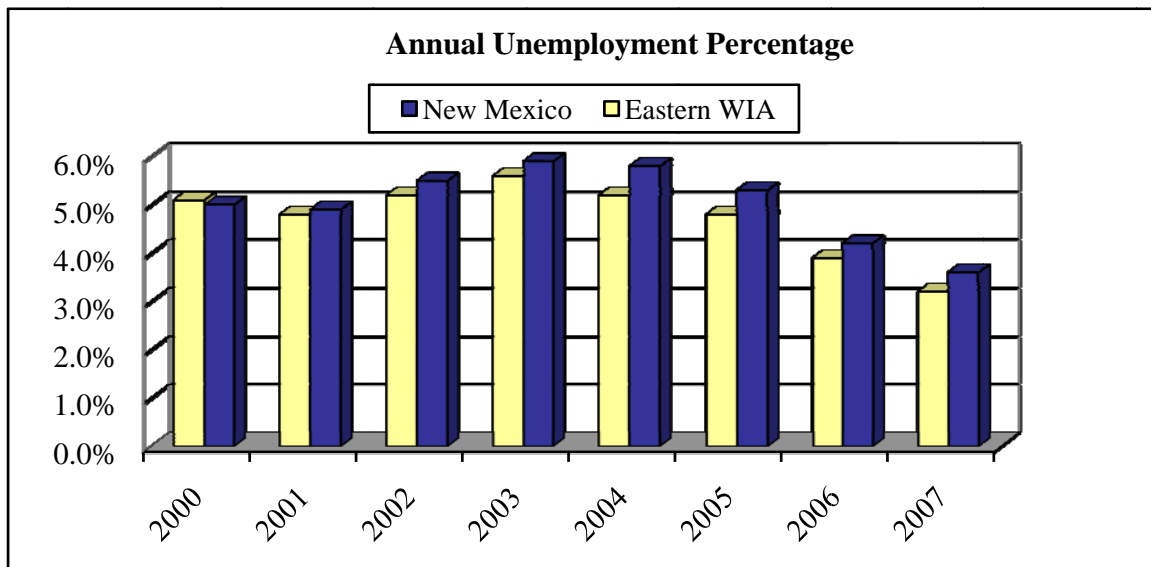

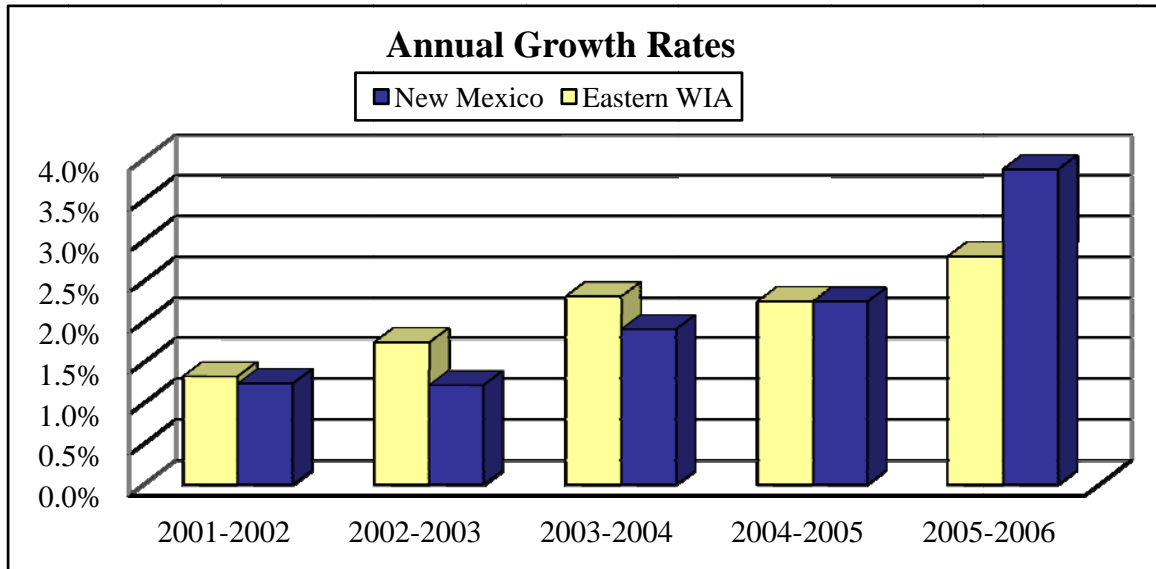

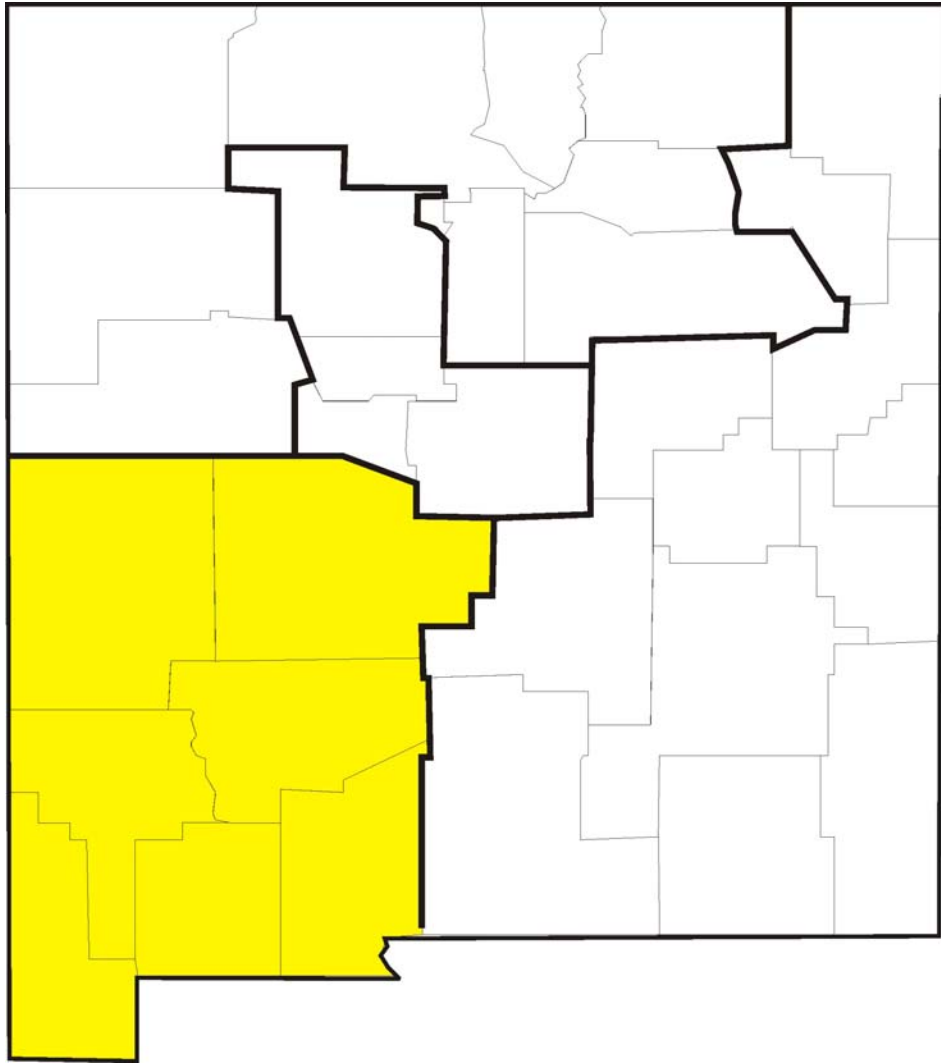

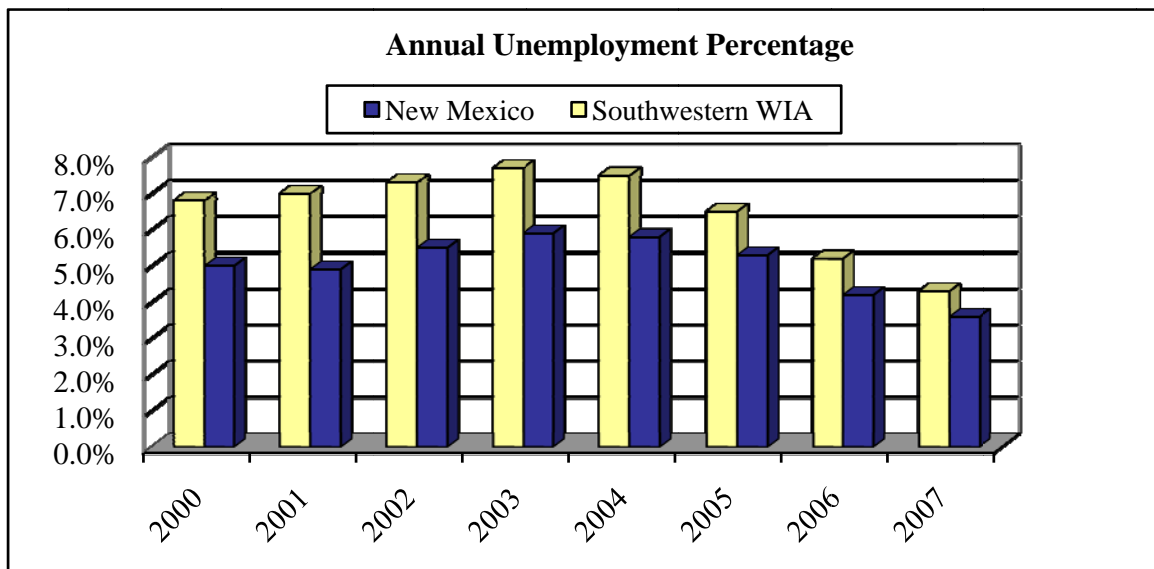

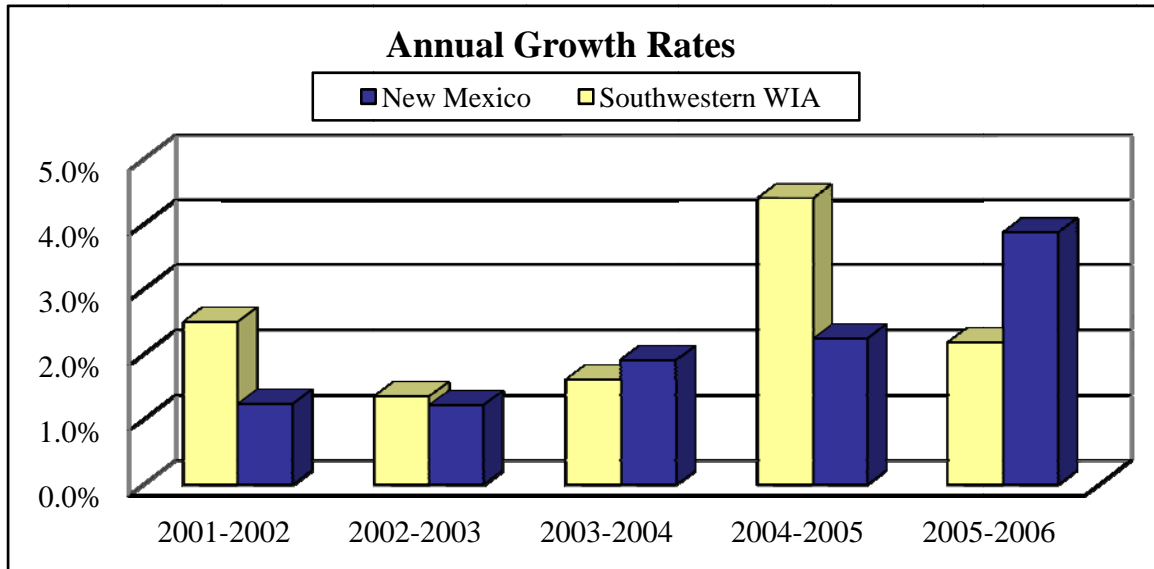
