# **Purpose of the Grants Management and Program Development Committee**

The Grants Management and Program Development Committee supports the Commission in implementing and overseeing a competitive grant process and ensuring that resulting programs, projects, and activities are carried out effectively, efficiently, and in accordance with various federal regulations, policies, and grant requirements. This grant management role involves a broad array of







responsibilities in three primary areas: project management and quality, financial management, and grant compliance.

# **Action Items Completed**

The Committee reviewed and affirmed the following guidelines for The Formula RFP for PY 17-18:

- The Formula RFP for PY 17-18 shall include all priority focus areas (education, healthy futures, disaster services, environmental stewardship, veterans and military families, economic opportunity, and capacity building) that were made available in the Competitive RFP PY 17-18;
- To apply for the Formula RFP for PY 17-18 an applicant will be required to apply for a minimum of 5 MSY or 10 member slots;
- Applicants that choose to select the focus area of Capacity Building for Formula RFP PY 17-18 shall provide a letter of commitment from each of the sites/locations selected to receive Capacity Building activities from the AmeriCorps program;
- The Formula RFP for PY 17-18 will not include an option for Planning Grants. Instead, interested
  applicants are welcome to reach out to Commission staff to explore possible AmeriCorps
  programs;
- As the source of funding is federal, the application of Resident Businesses and Veterans
  preferences would be excluded, per procurement(s) 13-1-21 (J) NMSA 1978. As long as the
  procurement is for awards made by the NMCCV with CNCS grants (funds), then the preferences
  would be excluded from all RFPs;
- NMDWS has allowed the Commission to provide grants on a three year funding cycle for its
  Formula Funding Pool. The Commission has determined that the top 1/3 of applicants may be
  offered three year funding and not all applicants be offered the option of three years of funding
  in order to mitigate risk.

### Continuation

 Programs that are awarded Formula Continuation grants and have failed to meet continuation contingencies shall be placed on probation by NMCCV, during which time staff will work with the program to take corrective action and satisfactorily meet grant requirements. Failure to meet requirements will potentially result in contract termination.

### **Termination**

 The Formula RFP for PY 17-18 will stipulate that any applicant who was was terminated by any stream of service shall not be eligible to apply for 3 subsequent program years following the termination.
